**GOSPEL REFLECTIONS**

The readings this Sunday invite us to reflect on the end times and the hope we have in Christ. The readings highlight themes of final judgment, perseverance, and salvation.

- **Final Judgment:** Daniel 12:1-3 talks about a time of great distress but also about those who will be saved. It reminds us that there will be a final judgment where the faithful will shine like stars.
- **Resurrection and Eternal Life:** In Daniel, we hear about those who sleep in the dust awakening to everlasting life. This gives us hope in the promise of resurrection and eternal life with God.
- **Christ's Sacrifice:** Hebrews 10:11-14, 18 speaks of Jesus' single sacrifice for sins. It emphasizes that through Jesus, we are forgiven and made holy.
- **Perseverance in Faith:** The readings encourage us to stay firm in our faith, even during difficult times. This perseverance is necessary to receive the promises of God.
- **Hope in Tribulation:** Mark 13:24-32 describes the coming of the Son of Man during troubling times. Despite these tribulations, we have hope in Jesus' return and ultimate victory.
- **God's Faithfulness:** The readings highlight that God will fulfill His promises. We can trust in His faithfulness even when the world seems uncertain.

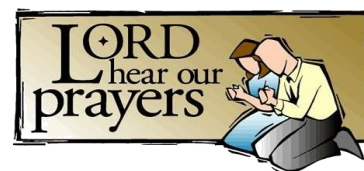

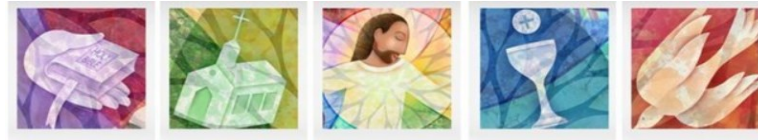

### Becoming Catholic...The Rite of Acceptance

For a while, a group of inquirers (people interested in the Catholic Church) have been meeting with the OCIA team here in our parish. During this time, they have explored their own faith journeys and whether the Catholic Church is the place to continue that journey. They have prayed about it and have decided to take the next step. This step involves a liturgical rite: the Rite of Acceptance (for the unbaptized). They will “assemble” publicly for the first time declaring their intention to the Church and the Church, in turn, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members (From the OCIA Paragraph 41).

We, the parish, as the Church, have a part in this Rite. We are asked to warmly welcome these catechumens into our faith family and to support them with our prayers.

This Rite will take place on Sunday, November 17, 2024, at the 7:30 a.m. Mass. We ask you to prayerfully and joyously participate in this Rite. Please take the time after Mass to meet and greet these people. They are embarking on a wonderful adventure, and you are a part of it. And please keep all of us, catechumens, candidates, parish sponsors, and team, in your prayers.

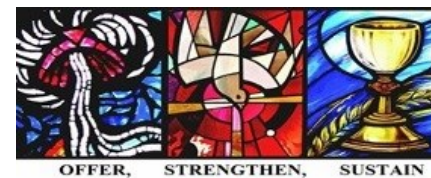

**The Story of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

Mary's presentation was celebrated in Jerusalem in the sixth century. A church was built there in honor of this mystery. The Eastern Church was more interested in the feast, but it does appear in the West in the 11th century. Although the feast at times disappeared from the calendar, in the 16th century it became a feast of the universal Church.

As with Mary's birth, we read of Mary's presentation in the temple only in apocryphal literature. In what is recognized as an unhistorical account, the *Protoevangelium of James* tells us that Anna and Joachim offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was 3 years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was still childless.

Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.
